WE, the undersigned, hereby declare that we desire to form a society under The Societies Act, R.S.A. 1955, and that:-

1. The name of the society is - The Bellevue Community League
2. The objects of the society are - Community League Activities
 - (a) To provide for the recreation of the members and to promote and afford opportunity for friendly and social activities.
 - (b) To acquire lands, by purchase or otherwise, erect or otherwise provide a building or buildings for social and community purposes.
 - (c) To encourage and promote amateur games and exercises.
 - (d) To provide a meeting place for the consideration and discussion of questions affecting the interests of the community.
 - (e) To carry on a literary and debating club for the discussion of topics of general interest, and to encourage the practice of public speaking among its members.
 - (f) To procure the delivery of lectures on social, educational, political, economic and other subjects, and to give and arrange musical and dramatic entertainments.
 - (g) To establish and maintain a library and reading room.
 - (h) To provide all necessary equipment and furniture for carrying on its various objects.
 - (i) To provide a centre and suitable meeting place for the various activities of the community.
 - (j) Generally to encourage and foster and develop among its members a recognition of the importance of agriculture in the national life.
 - (k) To sell, manage, lease, mortgage, dispose of, or otherwise deal with the property of the society.

3. The operations of the society are to be chiefly carried on in

BELLEVUE COMMUNITY LEAGUE

EDMONTON, ALBERTA

AUGUST FIRST 1966

At the Executive meeting of the Bellevue Community League held in Bellevue Auditorium on June 6th, 1966 a notice of motion was proposed with intent to amend the constitution of the league so that it would conform with the requirements of the Alberta Government and allow the Bellevue Community League to register under the Societies Act.

The amendments proposed are as follows:

1. That the word Constitution where ever it appears in the original constitution be deleted and the word bylaws be substituted.
2. That a section be added worded as follows:
"At any general meeting, by an extraordinary resolution the borrowing powers of the community league may be exercised."
3. That a section be added worded as follows:
"The secretary shall have custody and use of the seal of the community league."
4. That a section be added worded as follows:
"The books and records of the community league may be inspected by any member during a period one hour prior to and one hour following any general meeting and also at any reasonable time during the year by special arrangement with the president and treasurer."
5. That Section 35 of our present constitution be deleted and the following substituted:

These bylaws of the community league shall not be rescinded, altered or added to, except by extraordinary resolution of the league at any general meeting.

NOTE: The Societies Act provides:

"extraordinary resolution" means a resolution passed by a majority of not less than three-fourths of such members entitled to vote as are present in person or, where proxies are allowed, by proxy at a general meeting of which notice specifying the intention to propose the resolution as an extraordinary resolution has been duly given.

No rescission or alteration of, or addition to a by-law has effect until it has been registered by the Registrar of the Societies Act.
